#### KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE

At Broad Chalke, keeping children safe is always a priority and our safeguarding duty. Staff at Broad Chalke receive regular training. The purpose of these weekly updates is to raise awareness and support you as parents.

We are aware as we near the end of the school year pupils can feel more anxious. ### FOBS School Disco (please give consent & pay on ParentPay)

Please note the timings for the upcoming disco **EYFS & K\$1 4.15pm-5.15pm and K\$2 5.30pm-6.45pm.** Parents will need to register and drop children off at one of the outside school gates (these will be labelled). You will pick up your child at the same school gate. If your K\$1 child is in an enrichment club, before the disco, please let us know so we can give them time to change into their disco clothes!

### Change to School Timings

The DFE (Department for Education) has set the expectation that all mainstream schools should deliver a school week of at least 32.5hours by September 2023. In order for us to fulfil this expectation we will need to increase our school day hours by 5 minutes. Therefore, commencing 1st September, our school start time will be 8.45am and finish at 3.15pm. Doors will open at 8.45am and children should be entering school at this time. Doors will shut at 8.55am. Any child arriving after this time will need to enter via the main entrance and a late mark will be put in the register. We have consulted with the bus companies and they will directly notify parents of the pick-up timings.
